On behalf of the NCSM Board and the Philadelphia Conference Committee, we invite you to "Lead the Way" and join us at our Annual Conference, April 23-25, 2012.

As the theme – *Life, Liberty, and Mathematics for All: NCSM Leads the Way* – suggests, our 44th NCSM Annual Conference is designed to provide you with a rich professional development experience that meets your personal leadership needs. It features an exciting mix of over 200 sessions by a variety of speakers – mathematics education leaders as well as individuals from outside of mathematics education, including first-time speakers, veterans, and perennial favorites – who will address current issues related to equity and access; leadership of curriculum, teaching and learning; and assessment. A major focus of this year's conference is the implementation of the Common Core State Standards and education issues surrounding assessment, including implications of new technology developments for our work as mathematics education leaders. A second major focus is the importance of teacher leaders, mathematics coaches, and elementary mathematics specialists, and the work they do to support and encourage teachers for education reform.

Conference content strands include Bridging the Knowing-Doing Gap: Implementing the Common Core State Standards; ALL Means ALL: Promoting Equity in Mathematics Education; Mathematics Leaders Translate Vision to Practice: Developing and Supporting Coaches, Specialists, and Teacher Leaders; Making Mathematics Learning Visible: Implementing Formative and Summative Assessments to Support Student Learning; and Leadership to Enhance Mathematics Teaching and Learning for All: Helping Administrators and Other Leaders Support High Quality Mathematics Instruction. These strands address the key challenges confronting us as mathematics education leaders. Sessions on interpreting and implementing the Common Core State Standards in Mathematics are woven into each of these major strands. The program also features sessions that highlight how leaders have used the NCSM PRIME Leadership Framework as a tool at school, district, state, and provincial levels to change adult practice and increase student achievement.

NCSM is continuing its collaboration with the NCTM Research Advisory Committee to provide joint sessions of interest to both practitioners and researchers. Selected sessions are open to registered attendees at both the NCSM Annual Conference and the NCTM Research Pre-session at no additional charge. In addition, NCSM's Wednesday program features sessions of special interest to emerging mathematics education leaders.

As mathematics education leaders, it is our responsibility to continuously work to improve our own professional practice so that we can better support and lead others. Mission

The National Council of Supervisors of Mathematics (NCSM) is a mathematics leadership organization for educational leaders that provides professional learning opportunities necessary to support and sustain improved student achievement.

Vision

To achieve our NCSM vision, we will:

- Network and collaborate with stakeholders in education, business, and government communities to ensure the growth and development of mathematics education leaders.
- *C:* Communicate to mathematics leaders current and relevant research, and provide up-to-date information on issues, trends, programs, policies, best practices, and technology in mathematics education.

NCSM envisions a professional and diverse learning community of educational leaders that ensures every student in every classroom has access to effective mathematics teachers, relevant curricula, culturally responsive pedagogy, and current technology.

- **S:** Support and sustain improved student achievement through the development of leadership skills and relationships among current and future mathematics leaders.
- *M*: Motivate mathematics leaders to maintain a life-long commitment to provide equity and access for all learners.

Program Strands: Life, Liberty, and Mathematics for All: NCSM Leads the Way

1. Bridging the Knowing-Doing Gap: Implementing the Common Core State Standards

This strand focuses on important leadership issues related to the Common Core State Standards. Sessions will support leaders in understanding the standards and developing strategies to support implementation.

- What do mathematics leaders need to do to eliminate the gap between what we know about the Common Core State Standards and what we do?
- What is helpful for mathematics leaders to consider at the state or district level to make the Common Core State Standards actionable?
- What is helpful for mathematics leaders to know and do to support implementation of CCSS?
- What mechanisms or processes can be put in place to actually track or measure the degree of implementation?

2. ALL Means ALL: Promoting Equity in Mathematics Education

The focus of the strand is on structures that become institutionalized and part of the fabric of a district or state to embrace equity for all. How are we making it Actionable?

- How can the Common Core State Standards for Mathematics support "all means all"?
- How is Response to Intervention supporting equity in mathematics for all students?
- How can mathematics leaders help teachers of students from diverse backgrounds or students with varied levels of proficiency?
- How are leaders translating NCSM's position papers and/or PRIME into action to promote equity for all students?

3. Mathematics Leaders Translate Vision to Practice: Developing and Supporting Coaches, Specialists, and Teacher Leaders

This strand focuses on mathematics coaches, specialists, teacher leaders, and PD providers, and the work they do to support and encourage teachers for educa-tion reform in enhancing mathematics teaching and learning in their classrooms.

- What professional learning activities help mathematics leaders design and implement worthwhile mathematics experiences for teachers?
- What professional learning designs and opportunities help coaches, specialists, and/or teacher leaders become more effective in their work?
- What professional learning activities help coaches, specialists, and/or teacher leaders to improve mathematics content knowledge of teachers?

• How can current research and best practices on the coaching process inform our work with teachers in im proving mathematics instruction?

4. Making Mathematics Learning Visible: Implementing Formative and Summative Assessments to Support Student Learning

This strand focuses on strategies leaders can share with teachers to ensure accurate monitoring of student learning and adjustment of teacher instruction for every student on an ongoing basis,

- What do mathematics leaders need to do to implement a comprehensive assessment program that includes performance assessments and portfolios?
- How can formative and summative assessments be used to support student learning?
- How are Assessment for Learning strategies implemented within districts or schools to provide students systematic opportunities to review their own performance set goals for what they are going to work on to reach their achievement target?
- How does one align Assessment for Learning strategies with grading?

5. Leadership to Enhance Mathematics Teaching and Learning for All: Helping administrators and other leaders support high quality mathematics instruction

This strand supports the work of mathematics instructional leaders – focusing on strategies for enhancing the mathematics instruction in the classroom, as well as on strategies for communicating about important mathematics education issues with parents and other stakeholders.

- What do school administrators and mathematics leaders need to do to support the work of teachers within the classroom?
- What do mathematics leaders need to do to advocate and support high quality mathematics instruction?
- What is being done to develop an effective communication plan to articulate vision, goals, and next steps to school and district leaders, parents, students, and other stakeholders?


